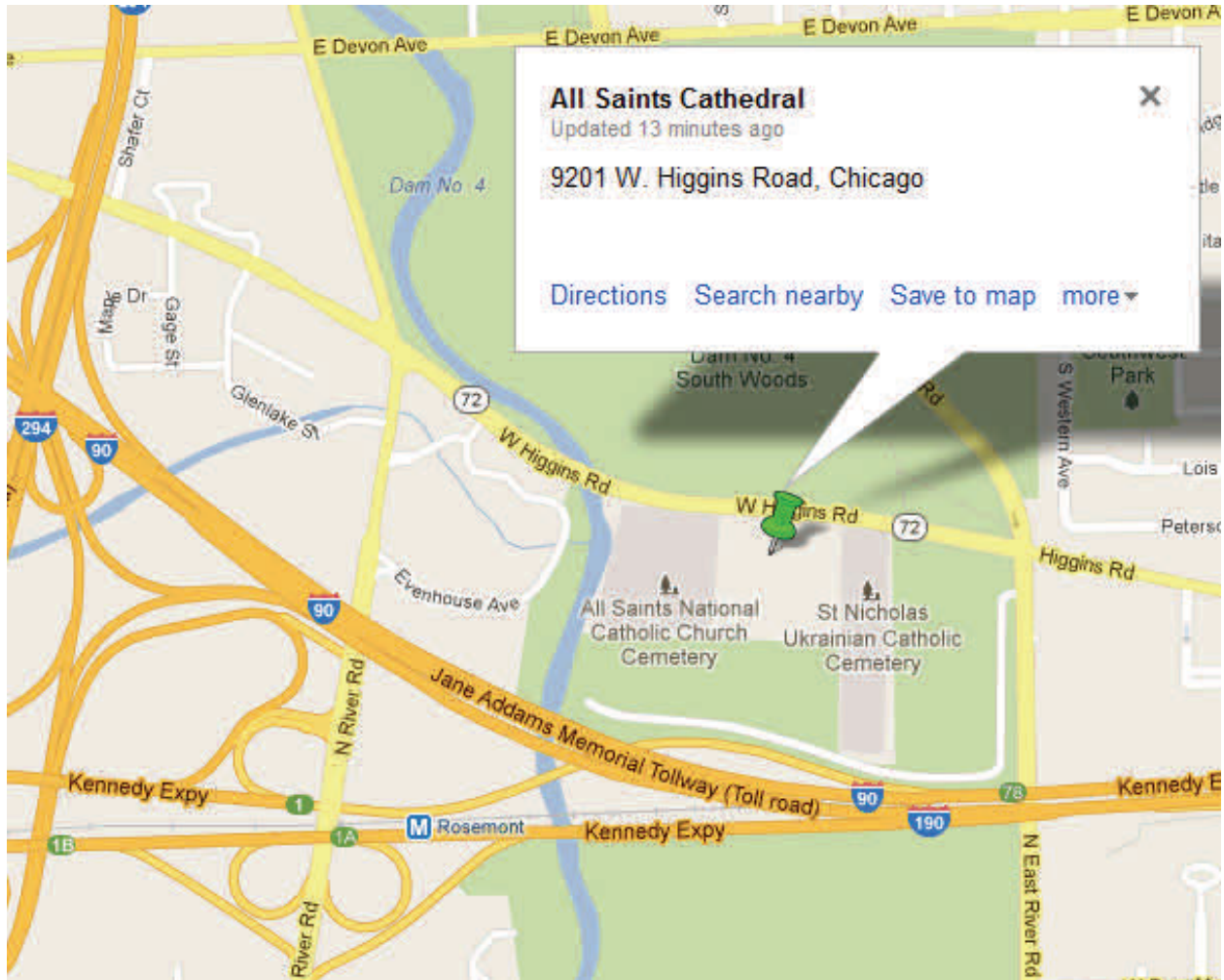

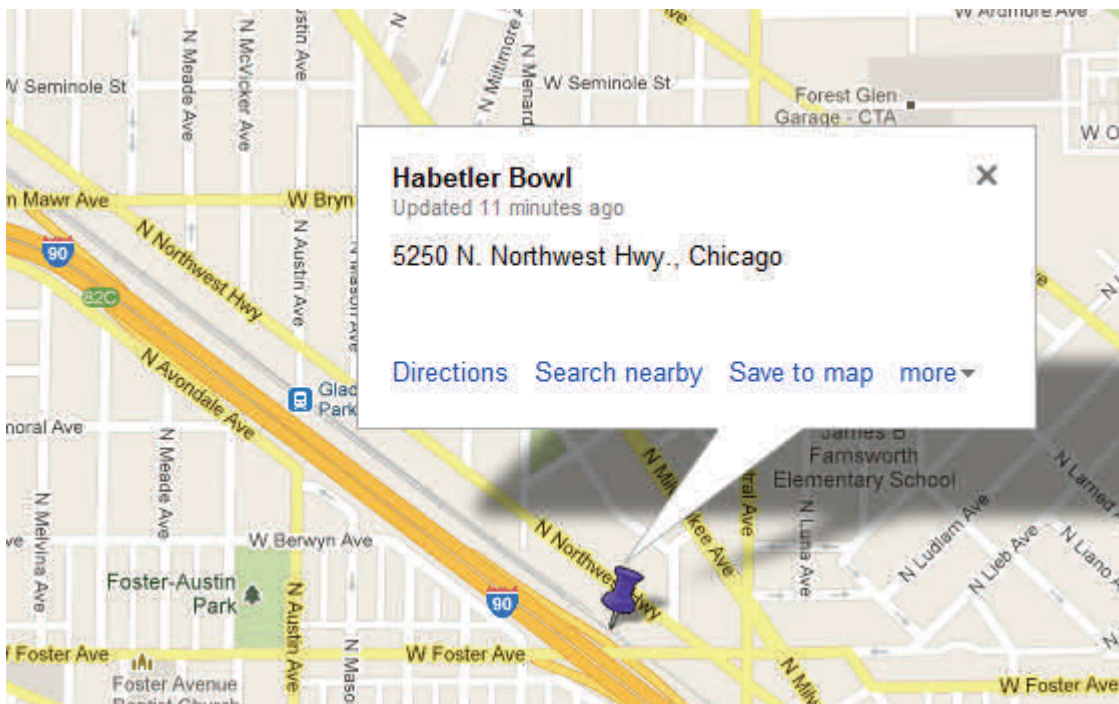
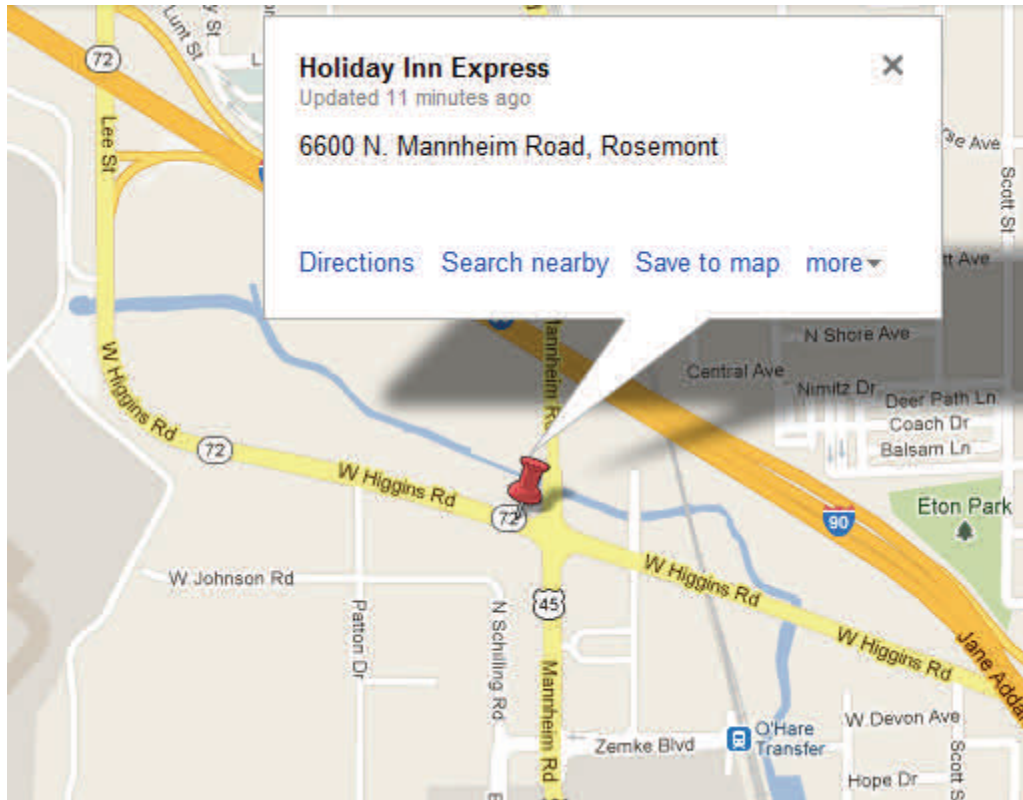

Transportation

Traveling to Chicago

Coming by plane, train or automobile (or bus)? Here's what you need to know:

Plane

All Saints is located virtually next to [O'Hare International Airport](#). Or you can fly into [Midway International Airport](#) located on the South Side of the City.

Train

[Amtrack trains](#) to Chicago arrive at historic [Union Station](#) downtown.

Automobile

Traffic can be heavy at any time of the day or night. This is especially true if you are driving through the downtown area. Make sure to give yourself plenty of time, and be prepared to pay [multiple tolls](#).

Bus

[Greyhound](#) buses arrive at their central terminal downtown and other locations, including the "Chicago Cumberland Avenue" station which is less than a mile from All Saints!

Getting Around Chicago

Chicago offers so many options for getting around! For convenience and flexibility you can drive and pay for parking in most locations. Or you can hop on a train, take a bus or cab, or catch a ride with a Tournament Travel Volunteer (see below).

Famous Chicago Attractions

Navy Pier

For over ten years, Navy Pier has been the place where Chicagoland residents and tourists alike come together to enjoy all the fun and beauty of a day on Lake Michigan. Navy Pier is a tradition, and when you look at all there is to do and experience it's easy to see why that tradition gets bigger and better every year! From dining and shopping, to a museum and boat tours of the city, Navy Pier is a must-see Chicago destination! Hours of Operation during Tournament weekend are Sunday – Thursday 10:00 AM–8:00 PM, Friday and Saturday 10:00 AM–10:00 PM. Visit www.navypier.com for more information and event details.

Millennium Park and “The Bean”

Discover a state-of-the-art collection of architecture, landscape design and art that provide the backdrop for hundreds of free cultural programs including concerts, exhibitions, tours, and family activities. In Millennium Park, you'll find a new kind of town square – a lively, spectacular gathering spot located in the heart of the city and a destination for Chicagoans and visitors alike. 201 E. Sears Tower (Willis Tower)

The Willis Tower is strategically located on Wacker Drive in the heart of the West Loop. Completed in 1973, Willis Tower rises to a height to 1,450 feet and is one of the most recognizable landmarks in the Chicago skyline and in the world. The recently added Skydeck allows you to step outside the tallest building in the western hemisphere and the third tallest in the world. At 1,353 feet in the air, the Ledge's glass boxes extend out 4.3 feet from Skydeck. Visit www.theskydeck.com for tickets and more information.

John Hancock Observatory

Even if you've been here before, you may want to visit the John Hancock Observatory again because there are new features like “Interactive Telescopes”, which guarantee a fantastic view even on cloudy days! To avoid the crowds, come before 11:00 AM or after 6:00 PM. Note...during Tournament weekend, the sun sets just after 8 PM. [Check the website](#) for more Observatory information.

Museums and Zoos

The Field Museum

The Field Museum is probably best known for its dinosaur displays, but it also has a rich and deep dedication to "the diversity and relationships in nature and among cultures." It currently holds, conserves and studies more than 20 million objects.

The Art Institute of Chicago

The Art Institute consistently ranks among Chicago's most-visited museums. From French Impressionist paintings to African masks to the new wing for Modern Art, the museum offers visitors a rich cultural experience.

Shedd Aquarium

The Shedd features an Oceanarium, Wild Reef exhibit, Amazon River exhibit, and more. They pride themselves on their dedication to conservation and the protection of wildlife habitats.

Museum of Science and Industry

Since 1933, this enormous museum has been dedicated to educating the public about science and technology. From the coal mine exhibit with a working elevator to the captured German World War II submarine, the museum's collections and hands-on exhibits seem almost endless.

Adler Planetarium

Adler Planetarium and Astronomy Museum, founded in 1930, is America's first and oldest planetarium. It now houses two star-gazing theaters, a unique collection of antique instruments, extensive exhibit space, and many hands-on exhibits. It also offers one of the most wonderful views of the skyline in the entire city.

Brookfield Zoo

There is more to see and do at Brookfield Zoo than you can squeeze into a single visit. If you take a little time to plan your day, you can make sure you fit in the animals, exhibits and activities that you're most excited about. Note...Brookfield is located in the Western suburbs, approximately 30 minutes from All Saints.

Lincoln Park Zoo

Lincoln Park Zoo is a world of wildlife in the shadow of skyscrapers. Located within a verdant park just minutes north of downtown Chicago, come hear a lion's roar echo off nearby apartment buildings and see gorillas climb trees as the Willis Tower looms in the distance.

Woodfield Mall in Schaumburg

[Woodfield Mall](#) is an enclosed shopping mall located in the northwest suburb of Schaumburg, at the intersection of Golf Road and Interstate 290. Woodfield Mall is the largest shopping center in the state of Illinois and one of the largest shopping malls in the United States. And it's only a 15 minute drive from All Saints.
